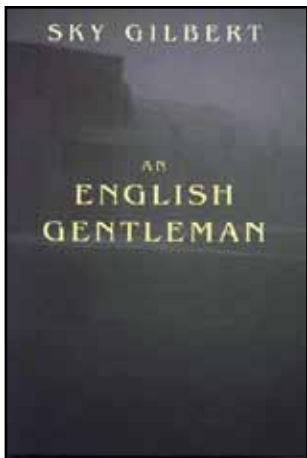

Barrie, author of *Peter Pan*, and his adopted son Michael Llewelyn Davies, he is able to peer into the complex relationship shared between the two men. As he reads into their lives, however, Manny's own relationships with other men start to blur the line between desire and mentorship, making his own conclusions about the letters less credible.

Life becomes even more complicated for Luke when he realizes that he doesn't share his brothers' interest in girls.



Other Men's Sons

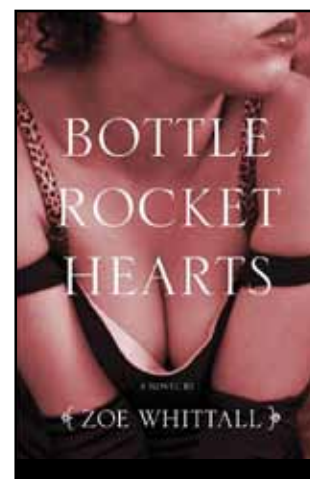
Michael Rowe ISBN 978-1-897151-01-3 300pp \$22.95

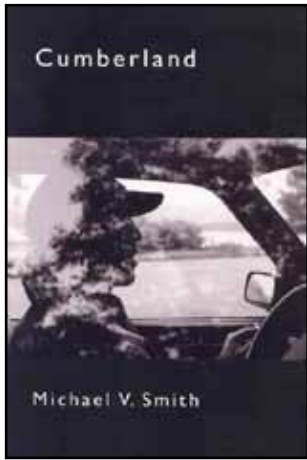

Cumberland

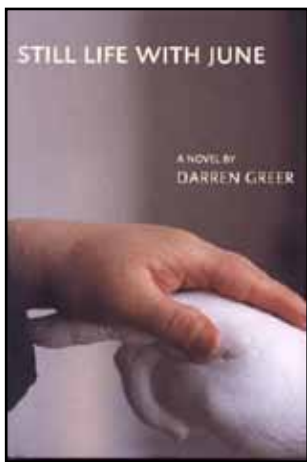
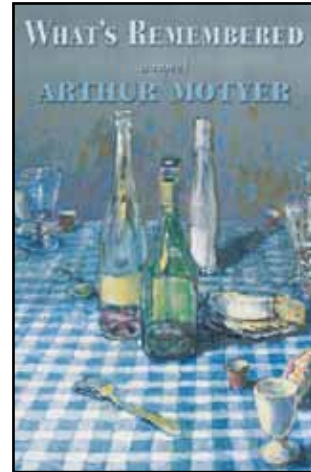
Michael V. Smith ISBN 978-1-896951-36-2 300pp \$22.95

Thirty-year-old writer Cameron Dodds steals his stories from the people he encounters daily at the Salvation Army Drug and Alcohol Treatment Centre where he works. When Darrel Greene, a resident of the centre, hangs himself in a closet, Cameron steals his file and the stories he finds within it. He also takes to visiting Darrel's older sister, June, who has Down's syndrome. As Cameron develops a relationship with June and delves further into Darrel's past, he makes many discoveries, none of which is more surprising than the one he makes about himself.

Cities of Weather

A collection of short stories that explores the struggle of modern identity, *Cities of Weather* is rife with vivid characters who must deal with everything from losing their jobs, to exploring their sexuality, to holding on to life-altering secrets. In this collection of sixteen personal essays, award-winning author Darren Greer sheds light on a variety of subjects, including modern art, nuclear war, September 11th, the gay literary canon, and gay identity. Through them, Greer provides insight into the world we live in, while sharing his own intriguing life story.
