
Both Cera and Tiresius are determined to achieve their goals, but, for better or worse, their actions begin to dismantle the framework and foundations of the autocracy itself.



DOUBLE KARMA a novel by **DANIEL GAWTHROP**

Curiosity about his father's homeland sends American photographer Min Lin to Burma to immerse himself in its culture and build his portfolio. But it's 1988 and pro-democracy activists are trying to overthrow the military regime. Min gets caught up in the movement after falling in love with one of its leaders. When she's arrested, Min flees to the jungle and, joining the rebels, comes face-to-face with a Burmese army captain who looks exactly like him. After an explosion kills his double, Min awakes in a hospital misidentified as a hero of the regime, causing him to pose as the dead soldier for his own survival.

Escaping in 1990, he returns to the US, building a new life on his growing understanding of his homosexuality, where he learns a secret about his family's history in Burma. Motivated by this knowledge decades later, Min decides to return to Burma — now Myanmar — to document a new wave of religious persecution and ethno-nationalism. Still haunted by the events of '88, and knowing his ex-girlfriend is being released from prison, Min must come to terms with his actions while seeking the truth about the double he met on a battlefield a lifetime ago.

Daniel Gawthrop is the author of five non-fiction books including *The Rice Queen Diaries*, which was shortlisted for a *Foreword Reviews* Book of the Year Award and an Independent Publishers Award, and *The Trial of Pope Benedict*. He has worked as a freelance writer and journalist in Vancouver, London, and Bangkok, where he was a sub-editor for *The Nation* newspaper. During a leave of absence from the Canadian Union of Public Employees, where he was hired as a communications representative in 2004, he spent several months living and working in Burma to prepare for writing his debut novel, *Double Karma*. He and his Burmese husband, a native of Karen State, live in New Westminster, British Columbia, traditional Coast Salish territory of the Qayqayt First Nation.





When the body is discovered by authorities on the ship, Lucy must do everything in her power to find the murderer before they look too deeply into her past.





UNTETHERED a novel by **RUTH RAKOFF**

During a teenage adventure abroad, twins Petal and Rose find their lives diverging in ways they could not have imagined, highlighting the complexities of their relationship and a shrouded family history.

Free-spirited Rose becomes enraptured with the ultra-orthodox Jewish community, while Petal delays her schooling to watch over her sister. Saddled with too much responsibility, Petal's clinical depression manifests in self-destructive behaviour. She finds refuge on a kibbutz as her sister grows further from her, marrying a man Petal does not deem worthy.

Years later, Petal confronts her prejudices about her sister's life, her resentment, and the effects of generational trauma on both their lives as she is called back to Toronto from New York City to support Rose during a crisis.

Told through the eyes of two generations, *Untethered* provides context and insights into orthodoxy, post-war experience, mental illness, generational trauma, and grief while laying the foundations for understanding and a path towards healing.



Ruth Rakoff is a writer and director of a non-profit organization with a Bachelors of Arts in English Literature from the University of Toronto. She is grateful for the privilege of writing and making art. Born in Montreal, Rakoff published her first book, a memoir titled *When My World Was Very Small*, in 2010. Rakoff weaves personal experience into fictional characters and narratives in *Untethered*, her first novel. She lives in Toronto, Ontario.


Built on fifty years of experience observing the growth of Canadian culture, *The Compassionate Imagination* is a radical reimagining of the role of art and culture in contemporary democracy. It proposes a new Canadian Cultural Contract that re-humanizes our way of living together by tapping into the instincts for generosity and compassion that find their expression in art.

Through the 1980s, the arts were deemed unimportant to the creation of an educated workforce. Reflecting a broadly-held political view that in a marketbased economy the arts were "a frill," they were deemed "unnecessary" courses compared to sciences, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

But with the COVID-19 pandemic moving into our rear-view mirrors, what kind of Canada might we make if we were to place art and culture at the heart of our mutual decision-making, return the arts to a central position in our education system — S.T.E.A.M. rather than S.T.E.M. — and ensure that all Canadians have access to our wealth of artistic practice and imaginative product?



Max Wyman is one of Canada's foremost cultural commentators. For more than three decades he wrote arts criticism and analysis for Vancouver newspapers and CBC radio. *The Compassionate Imagination* is his seventh book on the arts in Canada. He is an Officer of the Order of Canada, a former member of the board of the Canada Council for the Arts, and a former President of the Canadian Commission for UNESCO. 
In an effort to distract herself, Brooke throws herself into a school project about Neptune, which leads her to some startling discoveries and a surprising sense of connection to the distant planet.
